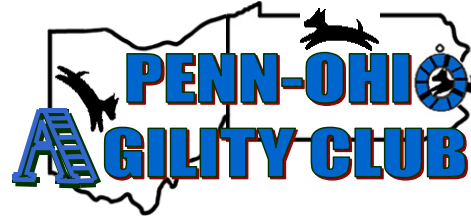

Directions to Show Site:

(Edinboro, PA is just south of Erie . Lakeside Commons is an old mall located right on Lake Edinboro)

From South – Take I79 north to Exit #166 (Edinboro Rt 6N) turn right (east)

Go 2.17 miles to Lakeside Commons (on left). Entrance is just after the cement bridge, if you get to Taco Bell you have missed entrance . Training center is all the way around back of the building right on the lake, Suite 600. Countryside Agility Signs in window ...unloading for in front of glass doors, please move car after unloaded. Please do not enter with dogs at front of mall!

From East and West - Take I90 East or West to Rt 79 South . Get off at Exit 166 (Edinboro Rt 6N) and turn left (east) and go 2.17 miles to Lakeside Commons on left .

ALL competitors must check in. All dogs must be measured prior to being checked in unless the dog jumps 26"(P22"), the handler sent a copy of their permanent card with entry, presents a permanent card, temporary card with 3 signatures awaiting a CMJ or check-in letter issued by USDAA / printout from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded.

If a copy of the permanent card was sent with entry, a competitor may check themselves in as outlined in the confirmation.

Entries and Closing Date:

All entries **must** be received no later than Friday April 30. Changes to entry cannot be accepted after the closing date.

To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or guardian for minors), received by the closing date and accompanied by the correct fees.

All dogs must be registered with the USDAA (registration has "U" prefix.) You may obtain a registration number immediately and a measurement card prior to the show at <http://www.usdaa.com/>, click on General Information. A registration form is enclosed with this Agility Test Schedule and may be submitted with appropriate fees and your entry.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS:

Competitors through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations, and will comply with them, including but not limited to the following:

-This test is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.

-No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time, except for as provided for in USDAA Rules & Regulations

-Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times.

- The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee views that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and it's Organizing Committee.

-Fault limits may be imposed at the discretion of the organizing committee and the judge.

-Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA Rules and Regulations. The heights are as follows:

Additionally:

- A withdrawal after the closing date due to injury of the dog/handler, illness OF THE DOG or for bitches that come into season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund minus USDAA fees plus a service fee of \$5 if supported by a written notice from a veterinarian. In such instances the secretary MUST be notified receive supporting documentation received by February 23. Any other withdrawals after the closing date will not be eligible for refund.

-THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal, or in the event that the test cannot be opened or completed for reasons beyond the control of the organizing committee.

- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for returned checks. Amounts shall be paid within 30 days of postmarked notice of returned check if such date follows the event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse

-Photocopies of entry forms are acceptable. You must copy both sides. Illegible and incomplete entries will be returned.

- No refunds will be issued for amounts under \$10.00

-This event will be held inside on stall matting. There will be crating area in the vicinity of the ring. Please bring your own water, come prepared. The site is a mall, you may leave things, at your own risk, on Friday and Saturday night. Please help us keep this site by keeping crating and exercise areas clean and picking up after yourselves and your dogs. Dogs are welcome in the bookstore, but **NO DOGS IN THE MALL!**

-There will be food and drink on site, both breakfast and lunch. Lunch will be provided to workers who work 2 classes/day

-Dogs must be properly kenneled (in crate or pen) or attended at all times. Please have x-pens for 2 dogs or more. POAC reserves the right to ask handlers to condense their crating area to make space for others

-Exhibition runs (FEO) are permitted only for dogs that measure up into a higher class for which they may be unprepared. However, no awards or qualifying scores may be earned. No change in program is allowed at check-in

-There will be NO equipment familiarization at this event. -A small warm up area and jump will be provided.

-All Competitors through entry at this event waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.

-Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, ALL COMPETITORS and HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT to USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known. All competitors and handles hereby release USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right

2010 IFCS WORLD AGILITY COMPETITION

As the U.S. representative of IFCS, USDAA will be sending a team to Europe for the 2010 World Agility Competition. To kick off the fund-raising, USDAA asks that you consider making a donation. TOURNAMENTS

The following Tournament classes are being offered at this event: (all competitors are eligible for entry to any of these tournament classes.) A copy of the detailed 2010 tournament regulations for each tournament will be available at the event or may be found on the USDAA website at www.usdaa.com.

2010 Grand Prix of Dog Agility® World Championships & Performance Grand PrixSM - Local Qualifiers

These tournaments are open to all competitors regardless of titles earned or skill level. Both are a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes obstacles as set forth in Chapter 3 of USDAA Rules and Regulations for standard agility, except that no table obstacle shall be used. Standard scoring shall be applied.

Competitors must have a ZERO fault round to earn a qualifying score for which qualifying ribbons are presented. One qualifying score is required for entry in Round 1 of a Regional Championships. Additionally, the first place competitor in each height class who has earned a qualifying score shall be eligible to enter the final round of a Type 1 Regional Championship without regard to their score in the first round. Such eligibility shall be documented through a "bye" voucher. A competitor may earn more than one voucher, and the voucher is non-transferable, can be used only once and must be submitted with the competitor's entry form for a Type 1 Regional Championship. See complete rules and regulations for Regional Championships, which are hereby incorporated by reference.

SPECIAL NOTES: When a local qualifier is held in conjunction with an agility test where all levels of titling are NOT being offered, 'bye' vouchers will not be awarded. (e.g. Starters/Advanced only, Advanced/Masters only, Masters only – **Tournament Only shows do not fall into this category**) Competitors with a qualifying score in the top 50% in each height class shall earn a bye into the semifinals at the World Cynosport Games. If at a regional championship a bye is earned by a competitor/dog team who has already earned a bye in that jump height, the bye is forfeited.

The rules may be found on the USDAA web site—General Information—Forms and Documents Library, or may be requested in writing by US mail from the USDAA office. A competitor must have two qualifications from local qualifiers, one of which may be from the first round of a Regional Championship, in order to qualify for entry to the world championship quarterfinals; however, where a competitor may choose to compete in both Grand Prix and Performance Grand Prix qualifiers during the current tournament season, the competitor is only eligible to compete in the championships of the tournament in which they have earned the most qualifications. Further, 2010 tournament rules stipulate that a competitor must complete all in Championship or all in Performance tournaments at Regional and National/World Championship.

2010 DOG AGILITY STEEPLECHASE® & PERFORMANCE SPEED JUMPINGSM TOURNAMENTS

Description: These tournaments are open to all dogs regardless of skill level or titles earned. These two-round tournaments emphasize speed. Each round will be conducted on a jumpers-style course that shall include at least two spread hurdles, a long jump and an A-frame and a minimum of 10 weave poles. Either the A-Frame or weave poles shall be required to be performed twice. Top competitors as set forth under Qualification & Advancement shall advance to Round 2 to compete for prize money, Tournament Top Ten points and Lifetime Achievement Qs. Qualifiers as defined herein earn the right to enter either the quarterfinals or semifinals at the Dog Agility Steeplechase® championships (semifinals for Speed Jumping) to be held in autumn of 2010. Competitors may not be entered in both tournaments at this event.

Scoring: Shall be conducted pursuant to USDAA Championship Program Starters level rules, except that scoring in each round shall be on a time plus faults basis, with a five-point penalty added to a competitor's performance time for each occurrence of a fallen hurdle or missed contact; running the wrong course shall be scored as an elimination as defined under Masters rules. For purposes of qualification calculations, a competitive

performance resulting in “elimination” as a result of performance error in the normal pursuit of a round shall be included in the count of competitors “actually competing” in the qualifying score computations.

Qualification & Advancement

Qualification shall be determined based upon the Round 1 scores. Only competitors with scores equal to or less than the maximum qualifying score in round 1 qualify. Qualifiers and placement winners (minimum of four, there is no maximum) in the height class are eligible to advance to Round 2 at a local qualifying event in order to compete for Top Ten points, Lifetime Achievement Qs and prize money (if awarded in Speed Jumping), provided they have finished the round with a score. Non-qualifying competitors running in Round 2 shall not be credited with a qualifying score regardless of their final standing.

Steeplechase Eligibility for Entry:

Regional Championships: A competitor must have one qualification at a local qualifier to be eligible to enter Round 1 of a Regional Championships.
World Championship Quarterfinals: Two qualifications, one of which may be from the first round of a Regional Championship will be required for entry.
World Championship Semifinals: Advancement from the quarterfinals by earning the equivalent of a qualifying score or by direct entry into the semifinal by having earned a ‘bye’ at a Regional Championship.

Speed Jumping Eligibility for Entry into the Championships: Two qualifying scores as defined herein are required to enter the semifinals at the Performance Speed JumpingSM Championships to be held in autumn of 2010.

Steeplechase Awards:

Local Qualifiers: Prize money shall be computed based upon 20% to 40% (at club’s discretion) of the total entry fees to be allocated in accordance with the payout table below regardless of the size of entry in any height class.

Speed Jumping Awards:

Local Qualifiers: Prizes or awards shall be provided at the club’s discretion. Should prize money be awarded, the following table shall be utilized

Allocable amounts to finalist positions that are not filled for any reason or allocable prize amounts less than \$3.00 shall not be paid.

Program eligibility in Regional and National/World Championships shall be determined as follows: Where a competitor has qualifying scores in Championship Program tournaments and Performance Program tournaments, a competitor must enter all Championship Program tournaments unless the total number of qualifications earned in all Performance Program tournaments is greater.

2010 DOG AGILITY MASTERS® TEAM DESCRIPTION

Description: This tournament series is open to all competitors with any dog, regardless of competition level (i.e., starters, advanced and masters). A team may be comprised of handlers with dogs from any two height classes (e.g., 12”/26”, 16”/26”, 22”/22”, etc). Each individual on a three dog/three-handler team competes in four classes of competition– standard agility, snooker, jumpers and gamblers choice. Top teams as set forth herein compete in a fifth and final class –the three-dog team relay to establish placements for prizes and awards. Each of the five classes will be conducted pursuant to USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that select performance requirements are subject to judge’s discretion. The following differences are specifically noted: • The performance requirements of the standard agility and relay classes as specified in Chapters 3 & 6 shall exclude the table (other than as a finish or relay exchange point) and may omit one contact obstacle in the course design at judge’s discretion. When the table is used as a finish or relay exchange point, no position or time requirement shall be imposed. • The performance requirements of the snooker, gamblers and jumpers classes shall generally follow the requirements of Chapter 6 of USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that:

1. The jumpers class shall include weave poles and may omit one or more spread hurdles.
2. The gamblers class may include or omit rules normally applied for point assignments, time allocations and joker requirements.
3. The snooker class course configuration and course components may be at the judge’s discretion.

The foregoing variances are subject to the review and approval of the tournament course reviewer and other provisions set forth herein.

Scoring: Masters scoring rules shall apply for the determination of faults in all classes. Time-plus-faults scoring method shall be utilized in the standard, jumpers and team relay classes (i.e., no standard course time is employed), with the following special values assigned for infractions: Each Refusal 2 fault points

Three refusals per dog or wrong course 1/3 of the Class Point Value.

Omission of a team member in relay (see special rules) 200 fault points

The resulting scores on a time-plus-faults basis shall be deducted from the standard point-basis for each class as set forth under “Special Rules” in order to calculate points earned by each team in a given class. In no case shall the team score for a single class be less than zero. These points shall be added to points earned in the gamblers and snooker classes, after adjustment as set forth below, to determine each team’s final score. Team ranking and placements shall be on the basis of cumulative scores through the five classes of competition.

Qualification: A qualifying score shall be awarded to competitors who compete in all five classes and whose team scores are within 25% of the average of the total points earned by the top three teams after the fifth and final class. In the event fewer than five (5) teams are entered, the minimum qualifying score will be calculated using the top score after all 5 classes. All competitors being entered on a team at the World Championships must be qualified through a local or regional qualifying event. Where a competitor has qualifying scores in both Championship and Performance Program tournaments, a competitor is eligible to enter the Performance Program tournaments at a regional, national, and/or world championship event only if

the collective number of qualifications in the Performance Program tournaments for the season are greater in number than the number earned in Championship Program tournaments as of the closing date of the event to be entered.

Awards: Prizes and awards will be made based upon overall team scores after the five rounds. USDAA will provide “Gold”, “Silver” & “Bronze” medals at local qualifying events for the best overall teams. At Regional Championship events in the United States they will provide a plaque for each member of the first place team overall. Each member of a qualifying team will receive a lapel pin in recognition of their qualification. Placement ribbons or rosettes may be awarded at the discretion of the host group.

2010 PERFORMANCE VERSATILITY PAIRSSM DESCRIPTION

Description: This tournament series is open to all competitors with any dog, regardless of competition level (i.e., starters, advanced and masters). A Pair or “team” may be comprised of dogs from any two height classes (e.g., 8”/12, 16”/16”, 8”/22”, 16”/22”, 22”/22”, etc). Each individual on a team competes in four classes of competition – standard, snooker, jumpers and gamblers choice. Top teams as set forth herein compete in a fifth and final class – the pairs relay, to establish placements for prizes and awards. Each of the five classes will be conducted pursuant to USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that select performance requirements are subject to judge’s discretion. The following differences are specifically noted:

- The performance requirements of the standard and relay classes as specified in Chapters 3 & 6 and modified by Chapter 7 shall exclude the table (other than as a finish or relay exchange point) and may omit one contact obstacle in the course design at judge’s discretion. When the table is used as a finish or relay exchange point, no position or time requirement shall be imposed.
- The performance requirements of the snooker, gamblers and jumpers classes shall generally follow the requirements of Chapter 6 and modified by Chapter 7 of USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that:
 1. The jumpers class shall include the weave poles.
 2. The gamblers class may include or omit rules normally applied for point assignments, time allocations and joker requirements.
 3. The snooker class course configuration and course components may be at the judge’s discretion. The foregoing variances are subject to the review and approval of the tournament course reviewer and other provisions set forth herein.

Scoring: Masters scoring rules shall apply for the determination of faults in all classes. Time-plus-faults scoring method shall be utilized in the standard, jumpers and relay classes (i.e., no standard course time is employed), with the following special values assigned for infractions:

Each Refusal 2 fault points

Three refusals per dog or wrong course 1/2 of the Class Point Value.

Omission of a team member in relay (see special rules) 200 fault points

The resulting scores on a time-plus-faults basis shall be deducted from the standard point-basis for each class as set forth under “Special Rules” in order to calculate points earned by each pair in a given class. In no case shall the score for a single class be less than zero. These points shall be added to points earned in the gamblers and snooker classes, after adjustment as set forth below, to determine each pair’s final score. Pair ranking and placements shall be on the basis of cumulative scores through the five classes of competition.

Qualification: A tournament qualifying score shall be awarded to competitors who compete in all five classes and whose pair scores are in within 25% of the average of the total points earned by the top three pairs after the fifth and final class. In the event fewer than three (3) pairs are entered, the minimum qualifying score will be determined using the top score after all 5 classes. All competitors entered on a pair at the World Championships must be qualified through a local or regional qualifying event. Where a competitor has qualifying scores in both Championship and Performance Program tournaments, a competitor is eligible to enter the Performance Program tournaments at a regional, national, and/or world championship event only if the collective number of qualifications in the Performance Program tournaments for the season are greater in number than the number earned in Championship Program tournaments as of the closing date of the event to be entered.

Awards: Prizes and awards will be made based upon overall scores after the five rounds. USDAA will provide “Gold”, “Silver” & “Bronze” medals at local qualifying events for the best overall pairs. At Regional Championship events held in the United States USDAA will provide a plaque for each member of the first place p overall. Each member of a qualifying pair will receive a lapel pin in recognition of their qualification. Placement ribbons or rosettes may be awarded at the discretion of the host group.

IF YOUR DOG MEASURES UP AND IS ENTERED IN TEAM or PVP:

The handler of a dog that measures up must notify the secretary immediately. Should the change in jump height make the dog ineligible for their Team, the secretary will make every effort to form complete teams from available dogs.

Should the dog not be prepared for the higher jump height, it may be run FEO at the lower jump height, but no qualifying scores may be earned, the dog may not be moved to the Performance tournaments and the team/pair cannot earn a Team/Pair tournament qualifier. Partner/team mates may run in the individual classes for tournament top ten points, Lifetime Achievement Qs and placements if awarded.

AWARDS:

- ❖ Rosettes will be awarded for 1st through 4th place in all heights in both Grand Prix and Performance Grand Prix Local Qualifiers. Qualifying Grand Prix competitors will receive maroon and white ribbons and qualifying Performance competitors will receive maroon and pink ribbons.
